## Working with shapes - transparency

## Setup

1. File $>$ New to create a new Artboard. 100 mm by 100 mm is a good size.
2. Click View > Show Grid (at bottom) to show a handy grid across the Artboard

## Drawing circles

3. Use the shape tool on the left toolbar - click and hold to see the range of possible shapes

Draw a circle. Hold down SHIFT to get a perfect circle. Aim
 to fill about a quarter of the artboard

- make the fill colour magenta (pinky/red)
- make the stroke transparent

4. Click the select tool on the left toolbar (the top arrow), click on the circle and copy (Edit > Copy)
5. Paste the circle (Edit > Paste) and drag it so that it overlaps a little
6. Change the fill colour of the second circle to orange

## Using transparency


7. Select one of the circles
8. Click Window $>$ Transparency (or find the transparency pop out on the right)
9. Change the opacity setting to $60 \%$. Do the same with the other circle


## Adding a third circle

10. Copy and paste one of the circles. Change the colour to green
11. Send the green circle to the back: Object $>$ Arrange $>$ Send to back

You can add lettering before saving your work. Then you need to
 export it to be able to use it (File > Export - export as a PNG file)
