

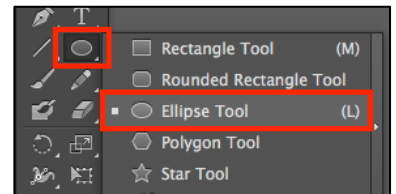
Working with shapes – transparency

Setup

1. **File > New** to create a new Artboard. 100mm by 100mm is a good size.
2. Click **View > Show Grid** (at bottom) to show a handy grid across the Artboard

Drawing circles

3. Use the **shape tool** on the **left toolbar** – click and hold to see the range of possible shapes

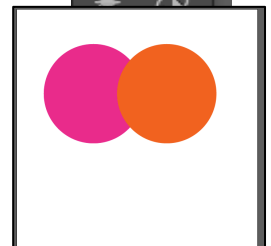
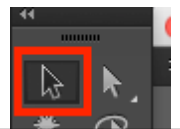


Draw a **circle**. **Hold down SHIFT** to get a perfect circle. Aim to fill about a quarter of the artboard

- make the **fill colour** magenta (pink/red)
- make the **stroke** transparent

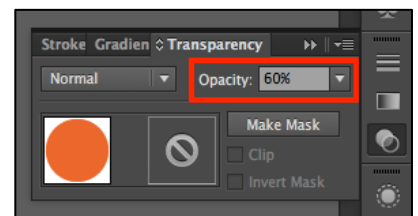


4. Click the **select tool** on the left toolbar (the top arrow), click on the circle and **copy** (**Edit > Copy**)
5. **Paste** the circle (**Edit > Paste**) and drag it so that it overlaps a little
6. Change the **fill colour** of the second circle to **orange**



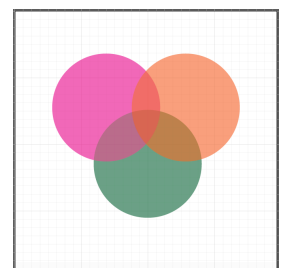
Using transparency

7. Select one of the circles
8. Click **Window > Transparency** (or find the transparency pop out on the right)
9. Change the **opacity** setting to **60%**. Do the same with the other circle



Adding a third circle

10. Copy and paste one of the circles. Change the colour to green
11. Send the green circle to the back: **Object > Arrange > Send to back**



You can add lettering before saving your work. Then you need to **export** it to be able to use it (**File > Export** – export as a **PNG file**)
