
Making a Word Balloon

You need to be working on a Photoshop image for this. The image needs to be the right size – otherwise you can't judge the size of text needed

Step 1: Add the Text

- Choose the **Text Tool** from the left toolbar and **drag out a text box** Don't worry about the writing in the textbox. That's just placeholder text and will disappear
- At the <u>top</u>, change the typeface to something like
 Comic Sans


- 3. The **text size** you use depends on the PPI of your image:
 - on a 300ppi image, use text size between 6 and 8
 - on a 72ppi image, use text size between 18 and 36
- 4. IMPORTANT: Centre the text
- 5. Type your words
- 6. **IMPORTANT:** use UPPER CASE. Probably
- Resize the textbox until you get something that looks about right



Step 2: Add an Ellipse

- 8. Find the **Rectangle Tool** on the **left toolbar**
- 9. <u>Click and hold</u> the tool and choose the **Ellipse Tool**
- At the top, make sure the Fill colour is white and the Stroke colour is black
- Draw an Ellipse that's about the right size and shape to act as the balloon
- 12. At the top, change the weight of the stroke to be a bit thicker try 3-5 px
- IMPORTANT: Swap to the Move Tool at the top of the left toolbar
- 14. Drag the Ellipse layer underneath the Text layer in the layer stack at the bottom right of the screen
- 15. If you've ended up with too many text or ellipse layers, this is the time to delete them






Step 3: Tweak the Shape

- 16. With the Move Tool selected, hold down Control on the keyboard and resize the ellipse. This gives you a bit more control over the shape of the word balloon
- 17. Move the text around if you need to you'll need to be on the Text layer and be using the **Move Tool**

Step 4: Add the Tail


- 18. Switch from the Ellipse Tool to the **Triangle Tool** click and hold on the <u>left</u> toolbar
- Draw a long, quite thin triangle the colours and stroke should be the same as your ellipse was
- 20. **Rotate** the triangle **hover** just outside one of the corners and a rotate option should become available
- 21. Move it into place to act as the tail



Step 5: Merge some shapes

The triangle is its own shape, so the borders don't work yet

- 22. Hold down **SHIFT** and click to select both the **Ellipse** and the **Triangle** layer in the **Layer Stack**
- 23. Click Layer > Merge Shapes (careful make sure you Merge Shapes)
 This creates a single shape
- 24. Once you're happy with your textlayer, merge the text and shape layersLayer > Merge Layers this time
- 25. Now drag the word balloon into place



Adding captions and narrations

This just uses a rectangle instead of an ellipse. Make sure text is **left aligned**
