

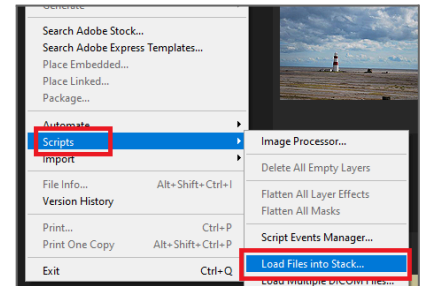
Horse in Motion GIF

IMPORTANT: You need to have downloaded and unzipped the **horse image files**

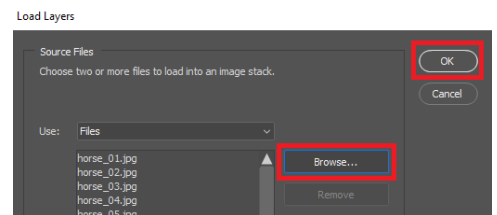
1. Open **Adobe Photoshop 2023**
2. Login using your **school e-mail address** and your **login password**
3. If a pop up box appears, press **Close**

Load the images

4. At the **top**, click **File > Scripts** (toward the bottom) >
Load files into stack



5. Press the **Browse** button
6. At the **bottom left**, click **On your computer**
7. Get to your **OneDrive**
8. Find the **Horse** folder (not the zipped one). **Open** the folder
9. **Click** on the **first image**
10. Hold **SHIFT** down on the keyboard and scroll to the bottom and **click** on the **last image**



This selects **all** the images in the folder – **Control + A** is a keyboard shortcut

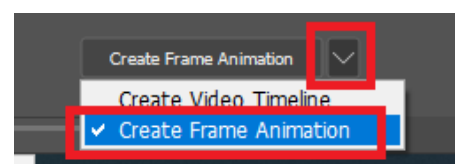
11. Press **OK** > then **OK again**

WAIT: It will take a little bit of time to load all the images. You'll see they appear in the Layer Stack at the **bottom right** of the screen they're all loaded in. But you'll only see one of the them on the main part of the screen

Create the Animation

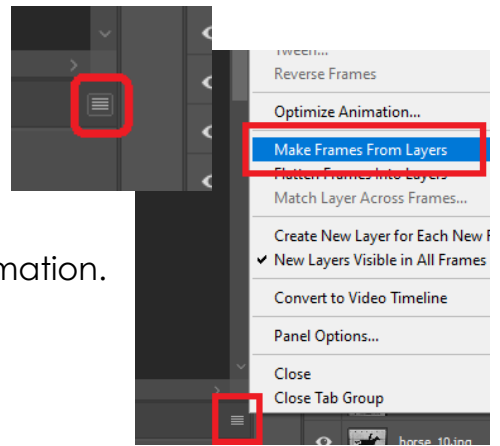
12. At the **top**, click **Window > Timeline** (way down the list of options)
This pops the **Timeline Window** onto the **bottom** of the screen
13. In the **Timeline Window**, press the **arrow next to** the **Create Video Timeline** button

14. **Change** it to **Create Frame Animation**
15. Now **click** on the **Create Frame Animation** button



A single horse image appears in the Timeline

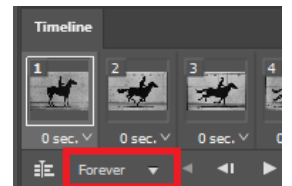
16. **TRICKY:** at the **top right** of the **Timeline Window** find the **three lines** (the hamburger menu). **Click** this and choose **Make Frames From Layers**



- Now the Timeline should fill with all the horses
17. Press the **play button** at the **bottom** to play the animation. It should work.

Looping

18. At the **bottom** of the Timeline window, check that the word **Forever** appears on the left. If it doesn't, click whatever it says instead and change it to Forever

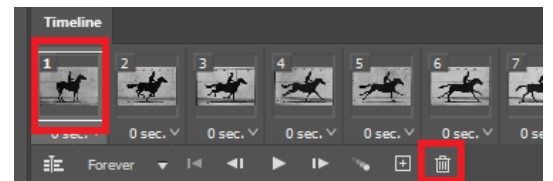


Problems:

There's one horse that doesn't match. It makes the animation a bit jumpy

19. Find the **standing horse** in the **Timeline**. **Click** that frame to select it.

20. At the **bottom**, click the **bin button** to delete the frame



The animation is also going **backwards**. Look carefully and you'll see

21. **Click** the **hamburger menu** and choose **Reverse Frames** to solve this

Saving your GIF

22. At the **top** click **File > Save as >** go to your **OneDrive** and save the file
This saves a Photoshop file which can still be edited easily. It's not an animated GIF yet – you wouldn't be able to use it on the web or PowerPoint

Export your GIF so you can use it

23. Click **File > Export > Save for web (legacy)**
24. Check it says **GIF** at the **top** of the window that appears
25. Click **Save** at the **bottom** (**NOT Done**) > go to your **OneDrive** using the **dropdown at the top**
26. **Save** your GIF with a sensible name
