

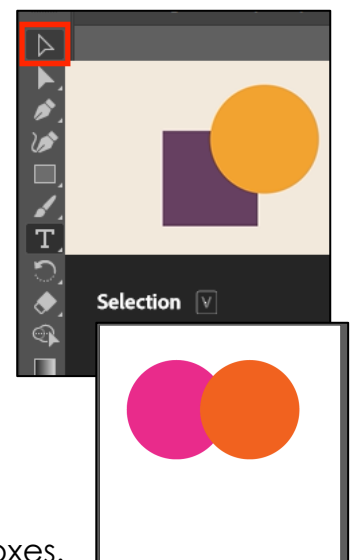
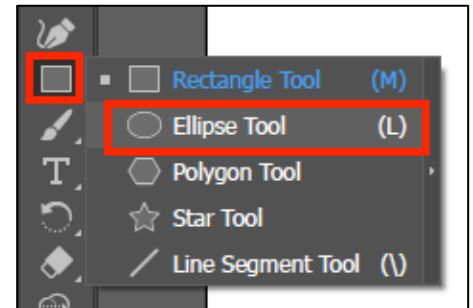
Working with shapes – transparency

Setup

1. **File > New** to create a new Artboard. Make it **200mm** by **200mm**
2. Click **View > Show Grid** (at bottom) to show a handy grid across the Artboard

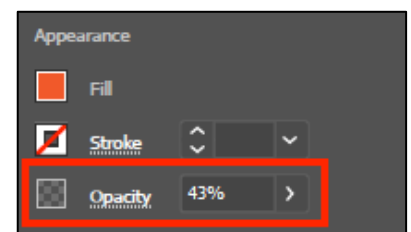
Drawing circles

3. Click the **Rectangle Tool** on the **left toolbar**
4. **Click and hold** to choose the **Ellipse Tool**
5. **Hold down SHIFT** to draw a perfect circle. Aim to fill **about a quarter** of the artboard
6. On the **right sidebar**:
 - make the **fill colour** magenta (pink/red)
 - make the **stroke** transparent
7. On the **left toolbar**, switch to the **Selection Tool**
8. **Click** on the circle, then click **Edit > Copy**
9. **Paste** the circle (**Edit > Paste**) and drag it so that it overlaps
10. **Change** the **fill colour** of the second circle to **orange**



Using transparency

11. **Select** one of the circles
12. On the **right sidebar**, find the **Opacity** box below the colour boxes. Change the **opacity** setting to somewhere between **40%** and **60%** to make the circle **partly transparent**
13. Do the same with the other circle



Adding a third circle

14. **Copy** and **paste** one of the circles. Change the colour to **green**
15. **Object > Arrange > Send to back** to send it to the back
16. **Save your work** and then **export it** as a **PNG file** (**File > Export > Export As**)
