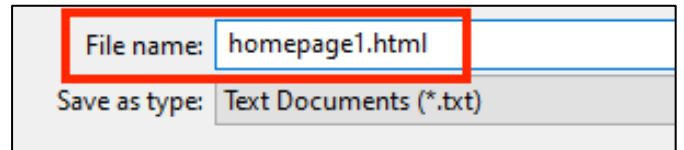


Website Step 1 – Making the Wireframe

1. Open a new **Notepad** file
2. Save your file now:
 - a. Click **File > Save As**
 - b. Go to your **web** folder
 - c. Call the file **homepage.html**
 - d. **IMPORTANT**: no capital letters, no spaces
 - e. **VERY IMPORTANT**: don't forget the .html bit



Create the wireframe.

3. Use the screenshot to produce the basic HTML code using <div> tags

```
homepage1.html - Notepad

  <div class="navigation">

The <div> tags produce divisions across the page

Each <div> tag has a name – called a class – which can be used later to make it look smart

4. Save your file – **File > Save**
5. Find your file and open it in a **web browser** to see what it looks like
It's pretty basic for now. That's OK.

Adding content

6. **Add content** to the **navigation** section, using the screenshot as a guide
Replace the word navigation with the content – don't add another div!

```
<div class="navigation">  
Homepage - New Zealand - Australia - Paris - About me  
</div>
```

This will end up being the hyperlinks to link the pages together

7. **Save** your file (**File > Save**) and **test it** in the web browser
8. **Add content** to the **footer** section, using the screenshot again

```
<div class="footer">  
&copy; 2023 Dave's Travel Blog  
</div>
```

This is the bit at the bottom where websites put the contact details and so on.

Note that © is a special bit of code. Can you guess what it will add?

9. **Save** your file (**File > Save**) and **test it** in the web browser
10. **Add content** to the **mainbox** section. This uses <h1> and <p> tags to add headings and paragraphs

```
<div class="mainbox">  
<h1>Welcome to my blog</h1>  
  
<p>Hello.</p>  
  
<p>Do you love travel?</p>  
  
<p>Are you ready to plan your next trip?</p>  
  
<p>Do you want to find out more about fantastic places all over the world?</p>  
  
<p>If so, you've come to the right place.</p>  
  
<p>I'm Dave, and welcome to my travel blog.</p>  
  
</div>
```

11. **Save** your file (**File > Save**) and test it in the web browser

STOP: next you need to make a banner image to go across the top of the page.

This will go in the header section.

Get a sheet and make the banner. Make sure you call it **banner.jpg**
