Website Step 2 - Adding Styles

You should have a webpage called **homepage.html** and a banner image called **banner.jpg**. Make sure that the banner is **saved in the same folder** as the webpage.

This guide will show you how to turn it into something that looks a bit more modern.

1. **Open** your webpage file in **Notepad** (Right click > Open with > Notepad)

Add the banner

2. Use this html to add the banner to the header div in your webpage

```
<div class="header">
<img src="banner.jpg" />
</div>
```

3. **Save** your file (**File** > **Save**) and **test it** in the web browser It still looks quite basic, so lets add some style

Adding styles

Styles are used to change the way that websites look

4. Add this code to the <head> section at the top of your HTML You're adding a <style> tag, some content with curly brackets and then closing the <style> tag. Don't forget to close the curly brackets! Make sure all of this goes inside the <head> section – check out where the closing </head> tag is

```
<head>
     <title>My travel blog</title>

     <style>
     body {
        font-family: Arial, sans-serif;
     }

     </style>
</head>
```

IMPORTANT: the semi-colon (the ;) at the end is really important

5. Save your file (File > Save) and test it in the web browser

Styling the header and navigation

That changed the font for the whole page. Now lets add some style to the divs

6. Add these two styles inside the <style> tags at the top of your document
These will style the header div and the navigation div, so they need to have
exactly the same name as the div – down to capital letters and everything

```
.header {
        text-align: center;
}
.navigation {
        text-align: center;
        font-size: 1.5em;
        padding: 15px;
}
```

IMPORTANT: each of these starts with a dot

IMPORTANT: don't forget the **semi-colons** (the ;s)

7. **Save** your file (**File > Save**) and **test it** in the web browser That's starting to look a little better

Styling the footer

8. Now **add** this to the style section at the **top**

```
.footer {
    border-top: 1px solid gray;
    font-size: .75em;
    padding: 15px;
}
```

This makes the text smaller in the footer div and adds a border to the top – which effectively runs a line across the page

Can you work out what **padding** does? Try changing the number and seeing what happens.

9. Save your file (File > Save) and test it in the web browser

Styling the mainbox

Styling the mainbox section is a bit trickier.

This wouldn't look great if we just centred the text, and we need to add some other things to the page as well.

You'll need to get the **Step 3 – Styling the Mainbox** sheet to do this
